Quick Series Description

FIRST AID: high-yield outline reviews written by students for students or by residents for residents. Designed to help readers pass exams. Includes USMLE, clerkship, and specialty board reviews. A few complimentary series titles provide USMLE-oriented cases and Q&A.

PRETEST: 500 USMLE-format questions and answers for required basic science courses and clinical rotations. Written by faculty, reviewed by students. Used for course exams and USMLE preparation.

CASE FILES: Cases written for use during courses and clinical rotations to improve course/shelf exam scores. Teach students to be better doctors by teaching in the context of real patients. Likely too much for USMLE preparation.

DEJA REVIEW: “Flashcards in a book” format for last-minute course and USMLE review. Requires an underlying knowledge of content which the books refresh (a true review of the material). Clinical Vignettes at the end of each chapter clinically apply content.

LANGE Q&A: Medical titles are strict Q&A, approx. 1,000 Q&A per book, for use as course, clinical rotation, and USMLE reviews. USMLE review books are “blue” and clinical review books are “red”. Allied health titles (e.g. Ultrasonography) provide high-yield, narrative content review in addition to exam-format Q&A; these are the “yellow” books.

ROAD MAP: Short, outline format books discuss the fundamentals of a topic. Two-color with some chapter-end review questions. Best used as either an introduction to a topic or for struggling students.

LANGE FLASHCARDS: Clinical vignettes on one side, topic discussion on the other side. For basic science course exams like microbiology for which students need to “cram” or memorize. May be secondarily useful for USMLE preparation.

PEARLS OF WISDOM: “Flashcards in a book” format for specialty board exams (physicians & residents) and allied health certification exams. Also useful for in-service exams and re-certification.

MCGRAW-HILL SPECIALTY BOARD REVIEW: Umbrella brand for books on various specialty physician licensing exams. No specific format.
